### October 8, 2020 – Honeyfield’s Cones Loses Kosher Certification

The UOS of South Africa issued an alert that due to a contractual breach and their refusal to cooperate with kosher ingredient restrictions, Honeyfield’s Ice Cream Cones are no longer certified kosher.

Honeyfield’s Cones were usually *yoshon* up until November, and their Date Codes were always featured in the UOS *yoshon* updates.

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### October 5, 2020 - Lieber's Chow Mein Noodles “Always Yoshon”

Ardent Mills, the flour manufacturer responsible for so much *yoshon* flour, confirmed that both Lieber’s and Wonton Food Company’s Chow Mein Noodles are *yoshon*, made from 100% winter wheat. (This is only true for the Chow Mein noodle flour, but not the case for other products like wonton wrappers.) Still, it is always good to know that certain products are *yoshon* throughout the year, regardless of lot or date codes.
