August 26, 2021 – cRc Alert on Mission Tortillas

Please be advised that Mission Foods tortillas and related products are certified kosher by the Chicago Rabbinical Council (cRc) only when produced in the USA. Mission Foods has recently started importing similar non-certified products that are produced in Mexico. These non-cRc products state “made in Mexico” on the label. The cRc reminds the kosher consumers to look for the cRc logo on the packaging as these are the only products certified as cRc kosher.

TYNI Notes: We get a lot of questions on Mission Flour Tortillas. Please be aware that when fresh or refrigerated, they fall under the same category as bread, and are likely chodosh already. The dates must be checked on them. According to their website, they have a shelf life range of 16-45 days. It has always been the policy of Project Chodosh to calculate dates using the shortest time when there is a range in order to be safe. We follow this as well.
