Hechsherim on Items Made in the USA

Any *hechsherim* from items made in the USA must have the word “Yoshon” in either English, or (“ ישן ”) in Hebrew, or have the phrase “ללא חשש חדש” printed on the package, in order to be considered *yoshon*.

Otherwise, they may be determined to be *yoshon* from lot or date codes stamped on the package.
